

Covid-19 Protocols

Please ensure that you contact the school immediately, if you, or any member of your household, develops symptoms of Covid-19. If you develop symptoms, you must arrange to be tested as soon as possible. You must also inform either Mr Monaghan, Mrs Hagan (Senior Teacher) or Mrs Karen McLaren (Secretary), once you receive your result. Where an individual has had a negative result and everyone with symptoms who was tested in their household receive a negative result, your child can return to school, providing they are well enough and have not had a fever for 48 hours. Parent/Carer/Teacher Meetings

Parent NI App

We have now developed the private messaging facility via the Parent NI App. 96% of parents have downloaded the app and verified their account. We ask those who have not yet verified their account to do so urgently. You will have received either a text message, or e-mail, with regard to this. All numbers/emails registered with the school need to verify. All further school communications will be issued either via the app, or by the school text messaging service, so it is vital to do so. Please note that it is also essential to inform us throughout the year, should you change your mobile phone number, or registered e-mail. New emotional wellbeing service – See, Hear, Respond

This service will work with children and young people in Northern Ireland who might need additional support to cope with the Covid-19 pandemic, offering practical and therapeutic support. It will also offer advice and guidance to any adults who are concerned about a child's mental health and wellbeing. The aim of this service is to provide the immediate support that children and young people need, to help them overcome their challenges and prevent problems escalating to crisis level.

The types of issues children and young people may need support for include:

- Anxiety around Covid restrictions and lockdown
- Being back at school
- Concerns for health of parents/ grandparents/ family members
- Help with isolation
- Relationships with parents & family
- Dealing with bereavement
